Registration:

- All youth participants must register on 4hOnline - <https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in>
 - Registration opens – Wednesday, May 8, 2024
 - Registrations closes – Wednesday, May 22, 2024
 - **Cost: Classes vary in price, refer to the worksheet for prices**
- A late registration option will be available for an additional \$25.00 fee in addition to class fees.
 - Late registration will open- Thursday, May 23, 2024
 - Late registration closes - Monday, May 28, 2024
- **Auxiliary Aids: If you have any participants requiring auxiliary aids or special accommodations, note that in your 4hOnline registration.**
- **Agents/ County Offices must certify all District Horse Show entries in 4-H Online by noon Wednesday, May 29th.**
- **Onsite registration for late entries, Stalls, RV Hookups and Shavings**
 - Onsite Stalls - \$60 for Sun. – Mon. or Mon. – Tue.
 - Onsite Stalls- \$85 – Sun. – Tue.
 - Onsite RV's - \$60 for Sun. – Mon. or Mon. – Tu.
 - Onsite RV's- \$85 – Sun. – Tue.

- Onsite Shavings will be sold for \$10.00 a bag. (No outside shavings allowed)
- Cash or a Credit card machine will be available.
- **No refunds will be granted.**

Eligibility

- In many of the classes at the District 4-H Horse Show, contestants will compete in the following age divisions:
 - Junior/Intermediate: 3rd – 8th grades (must be 8 years of age as of September 1, 2023)
 - Senior: 9th – 12th grades (not older than 19 years of age as of September 1, 2023)
 - *These age divisions will be in place at the State 4-H Horse Show as well.
 - Only **properly validated horses** will be allowed to enter.
 - **Review Texas 4-H Horse Validation Guidelines**
 - The horse **MUST** be owned or leased solely by the 4-H member, his/her parents (biological or stepparents), brother, sister, grandparents, or legal guardian. Horses owned or leased in partnership or jointly with any person other than those previously listed do **NOT** meet ownership requirements.
 - In accordance with Texas 4-H Horse Show rules, each contestant may enter multiple horses in each of the Divisions of the District 9 4-H Horse Show.
 - However, contestants may enter only one horse in each class of a Division.
 - **THERE ARE NO COUNTY QUOTAS FOR PARTICIPANTS IN THE QUALIFYING OR INVITATIONAL SHOWS. HOWEVER, ALL CONTESTANTS MUST MEET THEIR COUNTY'S ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE.**

General Rules and Guidelines:

- The **Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) regulations** require a Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) Test within the past 12 months for horses entering shows, fairs, or exhibitions.
 - Therefore, proof of a negative EIA test will be required for participation at the District 9 4-H Horse Show.
 - These papers will be checked upon arrival at the show. Refer to official schedule for a list of stalling and check-in times.
 - The test date must be good through the District 4-H Horse Show dates
- All District 9 4-H Horse Show participants should be familiar with the State 4-H Horse Show Rules and Regulations (2024 edition), which are available at:

- Class Requirements:
 - Drill Classes must have at least two (2) entries per category to make a class
 - Drill (2),
 - Precision (2)
 - Quad (2)
 - Working Cow Classes
 - must have at least ten (10) entries to make.
 - **Points from working cow horse class will not count towards high point.**
 - **Breakaway and Tie Down classes must have a minimum of ten (10) entries for the classes to make.**
 - Ranch Sorting
 - Contestants are allowed to enter and participate on **two teams**.
 - A contestant may only run with a respective team member **one time**
 - **Must have at least 10 entries to make.**
 - Each team will have one go.
 - This is **not** a progressive class.
 - Trail Class
 - The gate will be obstacle number 1.
 - Exhibitors will have 30 seconds to open and pass through the gate.
 - Failure to do so will result in the exhibitor being asked to move on to complete the other obstacles.
 - **Open/Non-Qualifying Division**
 - **Entries for the Texas 4-H Horse Show must be submitted through the 4-H Online System by July 1, 2024.**
 - **These entries to the State Show do not have to be certified by competing at the District level.**
 - **Updated non-qualifying classes for 2024**
 - **Qualifying Classes (Futurity Only)**

- All 4-H'ers validating and showing futurity project horses MUST be at least in the 6th grade and 12 years old or older as of September 1 of the current 4-H year.
 - Advancement to the Texas 4-H Horse Show in Qualifying Divisions requires participation in the Division at the District 4-H Horse Show.
 - All classes within a Division are available to the contestant if the contestant participated in at least one class in that Division at the District 4-H Horse Show.
 - Please note – just entering a class does not define participation.
 - A contestant must enter the arena and participate in the class to advance to the State 4-H Horse Show in a Qualifying Division.
 - **Attire for Timed and Cattle Events**
 - Riders are required to wear a long-sleeve shirt and western boots. Western boots shall include typical cowboy boots and lace-up ropers.
 - All other footwear is prohibited.
 - Boots other than leather soled boots are discouraged.
 - Western hat is optional, and, if worn, should be affixed in a manner to keep it from coming off the rider.
 - Caps are prohibited.
 - The use of spurs and chaps shall be optional.
 - Clothing should be neat and clean.
- **Tabulation:** Results are tabulated in accordance with Texas 4-H State Horse Show Rules as posted in the book on pages 12-14.
- **Ground Fee**
 - A Ground Fee of (see horse show worksheet for pricing info) per horse entered in the District 9 4-H Horse Show but not stalled at the show will be charged.
 - This fee will help cover the costs associated with the show.
 - Each exhibitor who is not stalling his or her horse(s) at the show is required to pay this fee for each horse entered.
- **Stall Fee**
 - A Shavings Fee of (see horse show worksheet for pricing info) per horse stalled.
 - This fee covers the cost of one bag of shavings in each stall which is required by the Brazos County Exposition Complex.
 - Each exhibitor who is stalling his or her horse(s) at the show is required to pay this fee for each horse.

- Additional shavings will be available for purchase at the show.
- **Emergency Medical Service Fee**
 - An Emergency Medical Service Fee of (see horse show worksheet for pricing info) **per horse** entered
 - This fee will help cover the costs associated with having medical personnel and vehicles on site at the show.
- Concessions will be available on the grounds.

- DO NOT PAINT hooves on sidewalk, aisles, etc; **only** on dirt/ shavings/ cardboard.
- **Please remember that no parent and or youth other than the rider entering the arena beyond entry gate. Please refer to rule #16 in rule book.**
 - No adults will be allowed to work with a horse during the show. This includes the warm-up and show arenas and any other designated area. The Committee and District Office Personnel will enforce this rule.
- Calls for classes rule, 3 calls and then you have missed your class.
- Please be advised **the break times have been taken out** of the schedule. Breaks will be taken at judge's discretion.

- No bikes, scooters, motorized vehicles etc. are allowed in the barns. Exception will be equipment used as Auxiliary aids.
- The show management committee reserves the right to cancel or limit entries in any class.
